

Pupil Premium

The Pupil Premium is an allocation of money to school which is in addition to the main budget. The size of the grant is calculated from our data about pupils who are:

- registered for free school meals
- looked after children
- Children of service families.

For the financial year 2015-16 we received a grant of £21,860 We have allocated this money as follows:
