Safer North Hampshire – Advice for Halloween and Fireworks events

Stay safe at Halloween:

If you're planning to enjoy Halloween bear these tips in mind:

- Think about costume safety
- Plan your trick or treat route and care when crossing roads
- Be safe and be seen
- Don't go alone: under 12s should be accompanied by an adult
- Never go into any houses
- Only knock on doors of homes displaying Halloween decorations

- Don't throw eggs or flour
- Respect people's right to not participate

Firework Safety:

Around 1000 people a year are injured by fireworks. Attending an organised display is the best way to enjoy them, but if you do use them at home remember:

- Plan your display
- Buy fireworks that comply with British Standards (BS7114)
- Keep fireworks in a closed box and use one at a time
- Read the instructions carefully
- Light the firework at arm's length and stand well back
- Never return to a firework once it has been lit
- Don't put fireworks in your pocket or throw them
- Direct fireworks well away from spectators
- Never use paraffin or petrol on a bonfire
- Make sure the fire is out/made safe before leaving

Swimming Lessons
