
If you or your child has any concerns, please speak to your class teacher a.s.a.p. so that it can be addressed.

Assessment

In June, the all Year 1 children will be assessed to check their phonic knowledge.

- This will check whether children have met the expected standard for word reading.
- This will be conducted in school with the class teacher or a familiar member of staff
- It is a pass or fail judgement
- Those who fail to pass will be given another opportunity to take the assessment in Year 2

 We hope that each year group will go on at least one school trip in an academic year.
