

Our Day

- Carpet session inputs cover all curriculum areas, Maths and English
- Independent learning Free flow for Child initiated learning and enhanced learning – this happens throughout the day between focussed learning time.
- Snack time children are encouraged to sit and chat with others.
- Story time.
- Tidy up Choose it, use it, put it away!
- Reading and sharing books/Phonics
- Lunch they go into the hall first then out to play in their playground.
- Carpet input for topic areas.
- Funky fingers/handwriting.
- Independent learning.
- Tidy up, story/sharing learning and home time.







Our Curriculum

- We create our curriculum relating to the children's interests and areas for development.
- Each half term we have a different topic
 - Autumn 1: All about me + Goldilocks
 - Autumn 2: Fireworks, Festivals, Autumn + Christmas
 - Spring: Animals
 - Summer: Plants, Minibeasts, Superheroes, transition into year 1!

There will be a topic web showing what we are doing each half term that will be on the school website and will be sent out on Arbor

Communication and Language (CLL)


